The Third Lausanne Congress on World Evangelization held in Cape Town in October 2010

During the Cape Town Meeting, what conclusions were reached in relation to creation and care?

This landmark meeting of evangelicals from across the globe concluded that as Christians we must repent of our involvement in the destruction and misuse of creation and commit ourselves to ecological responsibility in actively caring for everything that God has made, as an expression of our love for Him and for other people.

What is the goal of this conference?

To stimulate a creation care movement across the countries of East and Central Africa as part of a global campaign to start similar movements in other parts of the world.

Creation care is a gospel issue



under the Lordship of Christ

Scripture informs us in Romans 8:22 that “the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time.”

Across the globe our forests, agricultural landscapes, lakes, rivers, fish, wild animals and natural ecosystems are “groaning” under increasing pressure, and Christians worldwide are beginning to take action. For the sake of our neighbor, we must all join together in this effort to become excellent stewards of God’s creation.

This concept was affirmed by more than 4,200 evangelical leaders back in 2010 who attended the Third Lausanne Congress on World Evangelization held in Cape Town. Below is an excerpt of their conclusions in relation to creation care.

“The earth is created, sustained and redeemed by Christ. We cannot claim to love God while abusing what belongs to Christ by right of creation, redemption, and inheritance... If Jesus is Lord of all the earth, we cannot separate our relationship to Christ from how we act in relation to the earth. For to proclaim the gospel that says ‘Jesus is Lord’ is to proclaim the gospel that includes the earth, since Christ’s Lordship is over all creation. Creation care is thus a gospel issue within the Lordship of Christ.”

Come and learn how caring for creation can bring hope to the poor and advance the cause of Christ. Come and spend four days with African church leaders, scientists and missionaries, and be inspired to start a creation care movement in your own country.

- The impact upon communities across Africa, and the need for a God-centered response from God’s people
- Biblical Principles of creation care from the Old and New Testaments
- Creation care, the Great Commission, and missions
- Presentations from church and para church groups active in creation care
